

**GSC Faculty Meeting**  
**September 14, 2012**

Al Panu called to order. Will be information items and a vote on other items. Meeting is closed captioned.

Mary Carney announced visit by Vincent Tinto to be Oct. 11. Tinto is an expert in student retention & success. Will start day at Oconee and come to Gainesville for a Q & A in the afternoon.

Robert Robinson (ODIIR) introduced the Safe Zone Program with Power Point. This will be sensitivity training for faculty & staff for addressing concerns of GLBQQ students. Training participants will receive safe zone decal for door or desk. Training dates 9/20 for Oconee, 11/7-8 Gainesville. Email Robert to sign up. Robert also identified transgender restrooms on campus.

Allison Ainsworth (GSCWO) extended an invitation to join GSCWO. \$5 membership. Raise money for women's shelters and scholarships.

Al Panu thanked faculty for their hard work during the consolidation process. Core curriculum approved at DC & CCRC levels.

Sue Doyle-Portillo gave an update on the core curriculum committee's progress and developmental processes. Core aligns with new mission and supports students from both former institutions. Both parties have had to compromise. Core posted on portal for review. Area B was biggest hurdle, has to have global focus now. Area E is globally based. Some two hour courses added in this area. Questions were addressed in the areas of POLS (not a requirement) and GA Hist (not going away).

Al Panu acknowledged that core will require further changes moving forward. New core will be effective with new catalog (Fall 2013). Thanked committee for their work.

A faculty vote needs to be taken to approve programs currently offered at NGCSU, but not currently at GSC, in order to align programs for consolidated institution. All courses have been approved by BOR.

Chaudron Gille explained ballot format. All programs grouped by designation in accordance with BOR and SACSCOC documentation.

Jennifer Graff (CCRC) thanked committee. Committee passes all program proposals with the exception of the Physical Education portion, which was tabled. A vote will be held on 9/17/12 for the Phys Ed portion.

Faculty Asked to mark their ballots.

Discussions centered primarily on areas where both GSC & NGCSU had existing Bachelor degrees and the alignment of those programs:

Anita Turlington – English – Reviewed English faculty and feels we are in good shape

Diane Cook – Psychology – main changes were in electives

Mary Mayhew – Biology – NGCSU already had a program, some comparisons, pretty good shape

Maryellen Cosgrove – Education – will offer three different degrees

Paula Edney – Phys Ed requirement eliminated across degree programs

Lengthy discussion & review of degree programs with input and changes in light of eliminating Phys Ed requirement. Faculty voiced concern about job security. Assured UNG contingent will review and programs will enhance lives of students.

Al Panu assured faculty that challenges in communication had occurred and program concerns will be addressed in regards to curricular structure.

Chaudron Gille addressed questions regarding the “Blue Group” (Academic Affairs Working Group) and relayed Dr. Donat’s call for trust in the collegiate process.

Al Panu states that no guarantees can be made about job security, but he feels good about the security of current Gainesville faculty. Concern for jobs should not be primary focus of program structure.

Paula Edney spoke on behalf of Phys Ed instructors. Will vote in good faith that concerns will be heard and addressed.

Al Panu stated NGCSU had already eliminated the Phys Ed requirements and showed no subsequent fallout. States the importance of wellness will still be emphasized.

Jennifer – CCRC will count & deliver results via email next week.

Al Panu – thanked faculty for participation and discussion. Announced next meeting: October 19, Course Approval Process.

**GSC Faculty Meeting**  
**October 19, 2012**

Al Panu – Welcome & call to order. Follow-up from last meeting (approval of programs) & course approvals today.

May need one more called meeting November 16. If not, this will be last meeting of GSC Faculty. Introduced Dr. Donat to faculty.

Chaudron Gille – Course Approvals

Explained ballot – line for block voting by school and also listed each prefix. (Powerpoint of courses & descriptions by prefix)

School of BEHW. Call for motion to block vote. Move and 2<sup>nd</sup> received.

School of HFA. Move & 2<sup>nd</sup> received. Eric Skipper to email Chaudron re: foreign language requirement questions.

School of SS: Move & 2<sup>nd</sup> received. Discussion about Military courses and teach-out agreements with UGA

School of STEM: Move, 2<sup>nd</sup> received

Other course changes recommended by working groups: Move, 2<sup>nd</sup> received.

Dr. Donat advised that next NGCSU meeting is in 2 weeks, and they will vote at that time.

Chaudron Gille – Update on recommendations from working groups. Explained that curricular & policy groups send recommendations to them. Academic policies: approved. Calendars for summer approved. Curriculum approved.

Jennifer Graff (CCRC) – changes to THEA dept, AA, BFA, and HSDA approved by committee, faculty vote not required. CCRC voted yes for course changes.

Sue Doyle-Portillo – Core curriculum did not pass vote at NGCSU. Revision has GSC DC approval and was sent back to workgroups, NGCSU & CCRC. Counter proposal did not pass. NGCSU to submit counter-counter proposal, which will go to Blue Group for review.

Pat Donat – addressed questions about BA programs. Thanked Sue & the Core Curriculum Working Group. Addressed 3-year plan, goal of expanded access to Baccalaureate programs. Next Academic Year: Early Childhood Special Ed, English & Math, Phys Ed (upper level Phys Ed courses may be offered this spring). Communications will be further developed after consolidation. Hopes as we expand, Oconee will have increased community support. Discussed tuition levels and possibility of grandfathering for a while. Paula Edney asked why the elimination of PE requirement, while expanding athletic budget. Limited resources and guidelines regarding the use of athletic fees dictate the spending.

Robert Guyton – Faculty Senate updates. Reminded faculty they are welcome to attend Senate Meeting on October 29<sup>th</sup>. Dr. Pierce will be in attendance. GC Room 5705, OC Room 564.
